CHURCH HISTORY: (Con'd)

During the past two (2) years our community has expanded rapidly. New churches have been organized to meet the needs of the growing population. This growth has helped to offset our loss of membership due to the transfer of those in the armed forces.

At a congregational meeting in November 1958 the minister's salary was raised to \$4,800.00.

In March 1959 Mrs. Lawrence M. Wilcox presented the church with four brass offering plates, to the glory of God and in loving memory of her mother, the late Mrs. Katherin E. Saywell, of California.

An important step in the progress of the church was taken on June 28, 1959 when at a duly constituted congressional meeting, unanimous approval was given the proposal of the Session and the Diaconate that the Home Mission Committee of the Presbytery of Norfolk be informed of this church's desire to secure the building site on Shore Drive and Bayville Road, Princess Anne County. The site was owned by the Presbytery.

On October 14, 1959, Ruling Elders James Armstrong and J. A. Holland, Deacons C. A. Faust and V. M. Hopkins, and the Minister, J. E. Johnson, met with the Home Mission Committee to express the congregation's desire regarding the building site. The Committee, with Ruling Elder Joseph C. Nelson as Chairman, officially commended the officers and the Minister of the church for initiative in planning for the relocation of the church.

The Committee offered to give the site in Baylake Pines to the Bayside Presbyterian Church, provided architect and plans meet with the approval of the Home Mission Committee, and provided the church secures sufficient funds to erect an adequate building within a reasonable time. The site is worth approximately \$22,000.00.

CHURCH HISTORY: (Con'd)

At a duly constituted congressional meeting, November 1, 1959, unanimous approval was given to acceptance of the building site offered by the Home Mission Committee of Presbytery, with all of the conditions listed, and with deep gratitude. The Home Mission Committee was notified of this action, by letter dated November 11, 1959.

Our Minister of Music, Miss Nancy Moore, was married to Mr. John Smith, December 27, 1959. After her marriage, Miss Moore resigned. This vacancy has been filled temporarily by Miss Edith Snedegar.

The Young People have not had sponsors but have been very active under the leadership of our pastor and his wife.

Our Sunday School enrollment has averaged 315 and the offering has been approximately \$42.00.

The Men of The Church has been active with an average attendance of ten for the past two years.
