and, with the help of the Lord, they have borne fruit during 1955, and been fulfilled.

Women of the Church Conference, Massannetta. Our four delegates to the Conference at Massanatta were: Mrs. Frank Harrington, Jr., Mrs. George Goodman. Mrs. E. D. Ney, and Mrs. Charles Hill. Inspired by their experience, they led in the formation of an ever-growing weekly Prayer Group, which meets at the Church each Tuesday morn-

ing for worship.

In 1955, the Women of the Church assumed the responsibility of having attendants in the Nursery during Church Services. They purchased and installed a cross in the rear of the Pulpit, added to the kitchen equipment, and increased our Church Library. The arrangements of flowers, which add so much to our Morning Services, is another ob-ligation which they have assumed. In addition to the attendants in the Nursery, they have painted all the furnishings of the room. Clothes have been collected and sent to New Windsor, Md., for fe-chipment to Overseas Relief. An interesting project was the making of dresses for the children in a leper colony in Korea. At the September meeting, a recommendation was adopted that the second Tuesday of each month (Church Day) be devoted to making dressings for the Cancer Clinic. This work was begun in November, and will be continued indefinitely. During the year, the Women have been in charge of the "Family-Night Suppers", which are held whenever a month has a fifth Tuesday.

Money was collected by the continual use of "Blessing

Boxes", totaling \$100.53 during the year.

One new circle was formed, making a total of four for the coming year of 1956. The three circles of 1955 received offerings during the year sufficient for the establishment of a library in a small village in India.

The average attendance at the monthly General Meetings

during the year was thirty.
