The Engagements and Weddings are in one group, also, the obituaries are grouped. Mrs. Clark says as we go through the scrapbook and read the articles of the many activities of our church, as well as various other projects which our members are engaged in, you can see we have a church with members with many varied talents. It is truly wonderful to have a dedicated worker like Sally (Mrs. J. C. Clark, Sr.) to help our Historian in recording the History of Bayside.

Our Personal Faith and Family Life Chairman, Mrs. L. Dow LedBetter finished her two years as a wonderful Chairman. She continued to emphasize home visitation, stressing special emphases, giving devotionals at Council and General Meetings. Mrs. Fletcher C. Hutcheson, is our new Chairman and she has a committee of three and is planning to add more in 1970. This Committee assisted the Session Time and Talent Survey Committee and the Every Member Canvass Committee. Mrs. Hutcheson has encouraged each woman to participate in this years Adult Study and to join in the Special Worship opportunities of Thanksgiving and the Advent Season. Mrs. Hutcheson attended all program Council and Women's Council meetings, giving the devotional. She also gave the devotional at the November General Meeting of the Women of the Church. Mrs. Nelms came and taught the Laubauch Method - "Each One Teach One". We had 20 to attend. Five students are now being taught by some of our Ladies.

Mrs. Frank Hudgins our Ecumenical Missions and Relations Chairman, stressed the Witness Season January, February and March. A Mission Study Workshop was conducted each month preceded by a Family style dinner. All age groups attended and a special offering was taken to send to our Missionaries, Mr. & Mrs. Thomas Foley in Brazil.

Seven of our Women attended World Day of Prayer and our church was host for May Fellowship Day. We continued to send clothing for Overseas Relief. Our White Cross Quota was met. We celebrated our Birthday with a filmstrip in reference to building a Church Conference Center in Portugal and a Medical Center in the Congo. Our guest speaker was Mr. I. B. Dent, formerly of the Peace Corps. Our offering was \$260.00.

October 1st Mrs. W. F. Salkowski became our Chairman of Ecumenical Missions and Relations. Mrs. Salkowski has attended workshops, World Community Day and Church Women United. Sent clothing to Missionary Closet in Richmond, several large boxes were given in our own area for families that had a need for clothing.

First steps for an Educational Campaign for our Women was to give a copy to each circle of "The Lopsided World" to be read by members of the Circle. Lucille is doing a grand job after taking over for Dot.

Our Leadership and Resources Chairman, Mrs. J. A. Holland and her Nominating Committee had a very full year as they had many meetings planning and calling on each of the Women whose names had been suggested to fill offices of the Women of the Church. This was indeed a fruitful year as they presented a wonderful slate of Women who were unanimously elected. Mrs. Holland stressed Sponsor Day in Richmond, Annual Meeting of Women of the Church and encouraged all women to attend. Stressed Synodical Training School at Massanetta. Mrs. Holland brought books that were needed for the Church Library while in Massanetta, with the \$106.00 that had been alloted for this purpose.

Mrs. Holland had a workshop for all the new officers at her home. All outgoing officers were invited. A Coffee and Retreat preceded the workshop. Mrs. Hutcheson led the Retreat.

Mrs. Holland prepared a list of names of all college students and boys in the service and gave them to our minister, who in turn sends each the Church bulletin and the Church Newsletter along with a personal letter.

Mrs. Holland feels as she ends her term of office that these months were very fruitful and she and her committee went about doing God's work here at Bayside.

Mrs. James Morgan has begun her work with just as much enthusiasm as Chairman of Leadership and Resources as Mrs. Holland had. She has attended Friends of Seminary Day and what a blessing she received. It is indeed an eye-opener to attend the Seminary. Mrs. Morgan has encouraged reading of the Survey, using the Church Library. She had a wonderful luncheon for all Students and Service Boys that were home for Christmas with 24 attending. Mrs. Morgan notes that our young people are very impressive with their clean cut appearance, good manners and general attitude of happiness and well being.

The Circle Chairmen of Bayside have indeed had a wonderful year leading the many women in so many projects. We have two Task Force Circles, one Cancer Bandage Circle and eight regular Circles of the Women of the Church. All our Circles share in having shut—ins, visiting the Shore Drive Convalescent Home, taking gifts, shampooing the ladies hair, reading, taking carolers by to entertain the men and women of the home, keeping Tammy as our orphan and sending her gifts and money to buy clothing for her birthday and Christmas. Each Circle bought Easter lilys to be used in the Sanctuary for Easter and then delivered to their shut—in afterward. The Circles alternated in serving at the General Meetings and Family Night Suppers. The Woman always bring food to each Circle meeting for the Food Pantry for the needy. Our over 100 shoe boxes were covered also, 100 tissue rollers were covered and filled with hard candy to be sent to the Eastern State Hospital at Dunbar, Va. and Petersburg, Va. Hoods and head scarfs, knitted slippers, and caps were also made. Fifteen hospital gowns were made for Virginia Beach General Hospital.

There were 13 knitted lap robes made by a group of ladies that meet each Monday, and given to the ladies at the Convalescent Home. Also a large robe was given to the church to be used if anyone was ill. This group consists of members and friends of our church.

These women of Bayside are busy furthering God's Kingdom here on earth in many, many ways and as we go about our work we pray that new paths will be opened to each of us.

For the first time we didn't meet during July and August, and we have a Publicity Chairman, Pat Rudiger.

The Women of the Church gave a much needed dishwasher to the church.

Mrs. James Morgan continued being the wonderful Social Activities Chairman during our Christian Witness Season for our Family Night Suppers and Family Picnic.

In October Mrs. Fletcher Manning became our Social Activities Chairman and she is doing a marvelous job keeping up with all the special dinners, kitchen supplies and all other duties that are expected of her.

Our Nursery has been under the guidance of Mrs. Bryce Hodges and Mrs. Robert Roughton, Jr., Each lady has done a wonderful job. Our Nursery is well organized and our children love to come. Christian ideas are always kept in front of each child as they stay in the Nursery.

Our Telephone Chairman, Mrs. Carrie Young and Mrs. Lois Spivey have been very faithful in calling each officer for their meetings.

Our Card Chairman, Ruby Duncan has been a busy lady again this year. She always has a personal card and note in the mail to the many members and friends of Bayside.

Mrs. Mack Glass, our Flower Chairman, secured different people each Sunday to give the flowers for a Worship Service. As she goes out of office, Mrs. Robert L. Kays is doing the same wonderful service for our church. She is contacting people who have not given before.

As Historian of the Women of the Church it is with great pride that I accept each report from each officer to compile in a short summary of our years work.
