FINANCIAL REPORT AND ISSUES:

Balance Sheet (enclosed) & Treasurer's Report (enclosed)

Luann reviewed the reports.

Balance sheet is healthy – really good in General Fund. She did move some money from the money market to checking account to pay the bills. The deposits are down at this time, as expected. Looking at treasurers report last March vs this March we are up in income year over year. We are in better shape at this time vs the same time last year.

Looking at our options via the COVID 19 paycheck protection loans.

There is a charge for using a credit card % and a smaller fee for online check fee. A suggestion was made to update the website to include details on the cost of the fees so that those donating could cover those costs if desired.

Shared there was a donation from an unknown giver with a nice note about the church and wishing us well.

Motion: Elder Richard Guy Moved that was accept the report as presented. **The Motion Passed.**

The letter from the General Presbyter Liza Hendricks (enclosed) was reviewed.

CONTINUING ISSUES

- 1. 2020 Vision Update
 - Met last night George Wong advised that they continue to meet over Zoom, Discussion about the timing and reviewed quotes from the subcontractors. The group is going back asking for revisions.
 - Contractors say we can be done in 3-4 months if back in worship by Mid June we would interact and raise additional funds 34 congregants with a little over \$200,000 Goal is \$500,000 any additional funds would be used for further updates and improvements
 - George has asked when can we start construction? The contractor would like to be in now working. George asked if we should start now and hope the funds are raised or wait until we have the funds or pledges. The question is when do we start 80%??
 - Do we want to take a loan from a bank? Or take a loan from ourselves?
 - Pressing contractors for solid lean bids so we have a better idea of what we really are going to need.
 - Rev. Rollins shared that he believes and suggests that we allow for a worship service to provide a goodbye/closure and then a service when it is complete.
 - Elder Brenton shared that he agreed and while we are virtual it is familiar and brings comfort
 - Elder Brenton also shared that we should be cautious in this time as so many things are fluid
 - Elder Furedy agreed with the suggestion that we wait.
 - Elder Gluckowski suggested that we move ahead while it is empty.
 - Rev. Rollins shared that there has been many comments about being able to see the space is comforting.
 - Elder Guy suggested maybe starting to do the pews while we can as they won't be as impactful if we started there
 - George shared that if we started on the pews that we would risk damage as we move them back in to take them out again will be additional charge and again the damage.

Motion: Elder Sare made a motion that we put any decisions off until we have time (2 weeks) to review and think it through

- Elder Guy suggested that we hold it to a month by month
- Elder Brenton suggested that we maybe have votes via written communications
- Elder Ricks agreed that we have more time and put out bullets and then have some time to digest
- Elder Albertoli suggested that we hold and have an interim meeting to have time to think it through.

The motion passed.

We will draft bullet points and have session review and reply to all before we meet again.

Dear Sessions, Pastors and other spiritual leaders of PEVA,

Christ is Risen! Happy Easter to all. To state the obvious this was perhaps the most unusual Easter any of us have experienced but I hope it will be remembered as one that was very meaningful. As the poem suggests, I hope Jesus got our attention.

I still find myself saying that I am "going to church" when what I mean is that I will be worshipping or participating in a meeting virtually. Old habits die hard. Perhaps in this season of Covid-19 that is a good thing, that we hold in our hearts the images of preparing to be with our community and keep the expectation alive, of being together "in the flesh", or as Desmond Tutu once said, "in the meat."

Normally there is a bit of a letdown after Easter. Clergy call the Sunday after Easter, "Low Sunday," when the Easter crowds have disappeared. Will we have Low Sunday this year? Or will virtual worship and our desire to stay connected reflect a new normal?

In the old normal, a majority of pastors in the presbytery would take the week after Easter as vacation. This year going away is not an option. However, I am conscious that over the last month our pastors and elders have "shifted into lightspeed" to respond to the pandemic and all the anxiety it has prompted. Pastors have had to do things in ways they were never trained to do. They have discovered that planning for virtual worship takes more time --not to mention that they are learning how to preach to a congregation they cannot see. They have been told not to do the things they love, "being there" for people in person, seeing them in the hospital, holding hands with someone who is dying, having coffee with someone who wants their counsel. We have all been learning how to use technology to do things we had not imagined were possible or at least did not think our congregation was ready to do. Not to mention, people keep discovering how to improve and invent more opportunities for staying connected. I am inspired by the dedication, generosity, and in some instances, the courage, that you all are showing in your efforts to see Christ "in the least of these." Thank you for all your endeavors to be the Church, for your flexibility, creativity, and the evidence of your faith, hope, and love.

From what we know at present, we can expect the sheltering at home to continue for a number of weeks. We also know that financial uncertainties and other challenges will continue beyond the time when we are able to embrace one another again. Some people tell me they are bored staying home and others tell me they are exhausted from working remotely, juggling multiple responsibilities, and carrying the anxiety of this time on their hearts and minds. The days ahead will no doubt continue to require our patience, adaptability, kindness, a willingness to give everyone the benefit of the doubt, and the grace to recognize that we cannot be or do it all—especially not perfectly. I periodically remember an episode from the TV show MASH when Colonel Potter says, "I am not as perfect as I want to be." We need to offer that humility and grace to one another and ourselves.

Sessions, I hope you will encourage your pastors to take a stay-cation for at least a few days, to stand down from trying to keep all the balls in the air.

Pastors, I hope you will encourage Elders and all in your congregation to breathe deep, to pause as needed, to take time for beauty, for exercise, for calling friends and family, for taking advantage of the many resources for developing resilience and spiritual well-being. (Some are listed on the PEVA website.)

The Easter accounts in the Gospels tell us that the disciples kept being surprised by Jesus. When they were behind locked doors, confused and afraid; when they were heading to Emmaus trying to make sense of what had happened; when they went back to Galilee to fish their way back to normal and the fish were not cooperating—Jesus showed up. He got their attention. He brought reassurance, breakfast on the beach and instructions, "to feed his sheep."

And what now? Do you think he has gotten our attention?
