Next Meeting – September 15, 2020 7pm Elder Richard Guy Devotion Who or what is God to you?

God is the father of Jesus. God is sovereign. He created heaven and earth. When I die I will be with him in heaven.

Why is Jesus Christ important to you?

Jesus saves me and allows me to go to heaven. Jesus forgave all my sins and all the sins I will ever do by dying on the cross.

Polity is the structure of the church and gives us clear ways to organize our communities of faith and denomination. Polity is a group of people working together for a common purpose. The Polity of PCUSA consists of many levels. The bottom level includes the congregation and session. Then is the Presbytery, which for us is the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia. Next is the Synod, and we are in the Synod of the Mid-Atlantic. Then lastly there is the General Assembly.

What has been the most important moment or time in your faith life?

I don't know, but it could be this class. By not being baptized yet, this is certainly one of my first milestones on my journey.

If you could ask God one question, what would it be and what might God's answer be?

I would ask God why the world had a pandemic. He might say that it is to prepare us or that he had no part in it or that it just had to happen and it is part of a plan that only God can comprehend.

I learned that Presbyterians are still learning and reacting to modern times and events as shown by the fact that they/we are "reformed and always reforming." This is comforting because no one understands it all and it is important to admit that we are still trying to figure the world out.

How will your faith affect your daily life for the next few years?

Faith will help me overcome many obstacles including the Coronavirus pandemic as well as moving to Japan and adjusting to life there.

Statement of Faith - Sam Purcell

I Believe that God is our creator and our father almighty. God created all and is in charge of everything and he brought Jesus Christ on Earth to be a symbol for him on Earth. God to me is the creator of everything and a partner in life. He will always be there through the Holy Spirit. I could bring the younger perspective since I'm not an adult yet. One of the most interesting things about the Presbyterian Religion is that it takes a more modern take on traditional religion. The Presbyterian Religion is also more accepting of all people, which is a good representation of God, who accepts all. Also in the history of Presbyterians, there is a lot of conflict that results in a lot of the things we have today. Most of the issues are not even relating to God or religion, instead they have to do with politics and rights. With everything that I've learned throughout the many years, I will be able to make better decisions because I will know what Jesus would have done and I can also teach people the ways of the Lord and teach them the lessons taught in the Bible. With the church changing so much in the last ten years, I've seen many different methods of teaching and religion.
