# Welcome to our New Director of Faith Formation – Summer Moore



We are excited to introduce Summer Moore. Summer is joining the staff as the Director of Faith Formation. She will be responsible for developing and delivering a comprehensive program of Christian Education for children, youth, and adults.



Summer was born and raised on Kent Island in Maryland. She graduated Magna Cum Laude from Virginia Wesleyan with a degree in Social Work and Religious Studies. She obtained her Master of Divinity from Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary in South Hamilton Massachusetts.



While at Gordon Conwell she was the Practical

Theology Department Award winner for 2022.

Summer has served as the Housing Navigator for the Virginia Beach Community Development Corporation – working with Virginia Veteran’s AmeriCorps program. She also served as the Youth Group Director at St. Andrew’s Episcopal Church and Grace Community Church in Marblehead, Massachusetts. While in Marblehead she also spent time as the Direct Ministry Supervisor for Boston North Shore Youth Life.



In her down time Summer likes trying new recipes, volunteering, hikes, CrossFit, tiny museums, surfing, and movies.

**Lynne Owen:** *I feel that Summer is just the person God has led here to Bayside to help revive and strengthen our Christian Education program. She has a solid educational background rooted in theology and experience in youth leadership within*



A long time ago (way before you were born), the 277-mile-long canyon known simply to us as the Grand Canyon was formed from the violence of colliding tectonic plates and the erosion of rock from the Colorado River. Even today, scientists are discovering new layers of rock that have been revealed by years of erosion. When Teddy Roosevelt visited the Grand Canyon in 1903, he described it as “absolutely unparalleled throughout the wide world”.

Once, during my sophomore year of school at Virginia Wesleyan University, I needed to write a short analysis on a book of C.S Lewis'. I was given about three weeks to complete the assignment. Because I did not spend much time with the assigned book, I took less than three hours to complete it. When my professor read my paper, *patience* he described it as, “try reading it out loud to yourself and type it again”.

Producing good fruit takes time and patience.

Jesus’ disciples asked him once who was the “greatest” in the kingdom of heaven. It’s possible that they expected him to say one of their names. Weren’t they the best employees of God’s kingdom after all? Instead, Jesus flips the whole notion of greatness by placing a child in their midst. In order to be great in the kingdom of heaven, he asks his disciples to emulate the utter dependance of a child. Without recognizing their dependent status before God, Jesus tells them they are not eligible to enter the kingdom of heaven.

“Growth” in God’s kingdom almost never looks like what we’d expect.

Our notion of following God often needs to be formed through collision and erosion. Other times we learn best about God’s grace when we are asked to acknowledge our pride. At Bayside Presbyterian, we have the task of raising one another to be humble servants of Christ. It’s clear that this body has been hard



at work to that task since 1948. As Director of Faith Formation, I see myself as a participant in the work of engaging every person in this community with the reality of God’s love in

their lives. I believe that happens through the interlocking nature of relationships built within the church, and subsequently outside the church. Our congregation is well poised to serve Virginia Beach, Hampton Roads, and the world with our gifts, time, prayer, presence, and service. I’m excited to serve, learn from, and connect with all of you as we seek God’s will in our lives.

## FROM YOUR TREASURERS

### PAM & ED

Most of our church-goers know who PEVA is – the Presbytery of Eastern Virginia, located at 801 Loudoun Avenue in Portsmouth. We have had their General Presbyter – the Rev. Liza Hendricks participate in our worship service. You may not know that their Business Administrator is Regan Knutson who used to perform some bookkeeping services for us.



A lot of what we send (financially) to PEVA comes from the Global Missions Asking Budget. The biggest line item is the **annual church pledge**. In 2022, we gave PEVA \$32,000, broken into quarterly increments. As soon as our 2023 General Fund budget is complete (hopefully by December), we send our pledge to PEVA for the upcoming year. PEVA's member churches do likewise – if you would like to see what member churches pledged and gave, go to [pcusa-peva.org](http://pcusa-peva.org) website, click on "Financials" and "PEVA Monthly Financial Reports & Statements." Not only does our \$32,000 contribution support the administration and ministry of PEVA, it also supports what PEVA pays PCUSA and Synod on our behalf. PEVA must pay a per capita rate for every member of every church regardless of the amount pledged and remitted to the presbytery by that church. Per Capita supports the administration and ministry of Synod and PCUSA. This is one reason accurate membership counts is so important. The per capita for PCUSA in 2022 is \$8.98 per member; the per capita for Synod in 2022 is \$1.15 per member. For example, if Bayside reports 500 members, PEVA pays about \$5,000 to PCUSA/Synod on our behalf.

Global Missions also directs other designated giving that is sent through PEVA, including Disaster Relief, Sister Churches – Congo, Congo Maternity Hospital, Church Development – Lemete, Ecumenical Women Association – Pakistan, Mark Schreiber School – Congo, and Mogadishu Hospital Project. Apart from the Global Mission requirements, we send PEVA our Special Offering collections: One Great Hour of Sharing (Lent),

Pentecost (April/June), Peace & Global Witness (September/October), and Christmas Joy (Advent). PEVA makes sure all these funds get to where they ultimately need to go.

For all of this various giving, PEVA provides forms to complete to help let them know what our quarterly check includes.

PEVA is helpful to the Church Treasurer in a few other ways too – they instruct what we must retain for church financial records. And, they provide information for fair compensation guidelines for pastors, and fringe benefit changes.

## Hurricane Florence Recovery Mission Trip October 17-21, 2022

In September 2018 Hurricane Florence devastated many communities in the Carolinas. Faith Works Coalition (FWC) responded in April 2019 repairing/restoring damaged homes. Unfortunately, the pandemic shut down most of the disaster relief efforts. Baptists on Mission in New Bern has requested our assistance with repairing some of the 60 plus homes that have not yet been restored from the hurricane damage.

FWC is forming a Mission Team to travel to New Bern from October 17- 21, 2022, (Monday to Friday). Volunteers may work all or part of the week.

We will be carpooling to New Bern. Volunteers can form their own carpool or we can help link up riders with drivers. Drivers should plan to arrive by 9am on Monday morning and return home on Friday. We will be staying at the Baptists on Mission - New Bern Rebuild Center, 2108 Old Cherry Point Rd, New Bern, NC 28560, 252-571-6347. It is a renovated

warehouse being used for housing and feeding volunteers during this week of rebuilding. Volunteers are expected to pay \$10/day to offset costs of 3 meals a day and operation of the site in addition to assisting with the cleaning and meal prep.



FWC and Baptists will provide major tools. Volunteers are encouraged to bring their personal hand tools.

Please join in this effort. Anyone can be of help; no construction experience is necessary; willing hands and a willing heart to serve the Lord are all that is needed.


As the battle in Europe rages, Ava and Elaine find themselves connecting through coded messages and discovering hope in the face of war.


**Tuesday, November 8:**


