## Norfolk Presbytery Bayside Presbyterian Church Virginia Beach, Va. 1979

We, the women of Bayside, look back over another year of growth, service and love. We are fortunate that we have been encouraged in service to our Lord in ways that are most suited to our individual abilities and lifestyles. We senior members are gratified that so many young people have joined us. We are proud that our Circles offer so many facets of service to our Christian community of women; and so much emotional, and if need be, physical support. Since no one could have said it better, I am going to directly quote from Aundrea Edwards' report on the Circles (as Vice President of our WOC from the period January 1, 1979 to October 1, 1979.)

"This has been a busy, but productive year for our seven active circles, approximately 150 women, here at Bayside. We also have seven women serving on our session.

We....

Supported the STOP program, Shore Drive Convalescent Home, our Bible School, and stocked our food pantry.

Contributed to a flower fund in order for the 250 patients at the Medic Home in Virginia Beach to receive a red flower at Christmas.

Thoroughly cleaned the choir loft and filed all music.

Attended District Conferences.

Hosted the World Day of Prayer. Approximately 120 people attended. Caroline Anderson was our co-ordinator.

Contacted all new members, inviting each woman to join a circle.

Helped plan and cook for our church's 25th birthday celebration.

Made 183 pads for the American Cancer Society; (as of October 1979).

Made and delivered 12 lap robes and 15 pairs of slippers to the Shore Drive Convalescent Home. Also, 11 crib coverlets, 17 pairs of booties, 12 terry cloth bibs, and 1 sweater were made for St. Mary's Infant Home; (as of October 1979).

Thoroughly cleaned and inventoried the kitchen, purchasing 6 pitchers and 4 cookie sheets.

Organized, painted, and scrubbed our Fellowship Hall giving it a badly needed "facelift".

Made and donated 26 A-line dresses for the White Cross.

Started a drapery fund with the hopes of making drapes for our Fellowship Hall in January.

Started a Youth Club for grades 4-7.

Our present Vice President, Mrs. Bernice Damuth, further reports on our Circles as follows;

"About 86 women attended the Circle meetings since September.

One group's goal of Spiritual growth through love and fellowship extends to all of our women. Many gave support to Circle member's families while they were ill or hospitalized, by bringing meals to the home.

Gave money for blankets for World Wide Blanket fund.

Gave donations toward a needy family at Christmas.

Attended World Community Day in support of "Church Women United".

Gave donations toward Student Fund.

Knitted 17 scarves for Shore Drive Convalescent Home at Christmas.

Gave poinsettias for altar.

Gave money for special purchase of meats for the food pantry.

Made 62 cancer pads.

Maintain 4 & 5 year old nursery during 11 A.M. worship."

Excerpt from report of Mrs. Brum Tefft, our WOC President serving for her 2nd year in office.

"During the first quarter of 1979-80 I have presided over all monthly council meetings and helped with plans for our activities. I have visited one or more circles each month in their regular meetings. In December I met with the Orientation class to explain something of our organization and purpose to them.

I attended the District meeting at Christ Church in September and the mid-year District committee meeting with Presidents at Makemie Woods in November. Both were very informative. I also attended World Community Day sponsored by Church Women United Forum."

Mrs. Aundrea Edwards, our out-going Vice President reported the following duties covering her term of office.

"As Vice President of the Women of the Church of Bayside Presbyterian I have attended each WOC Council meeting and contacted each woman new to the church, inviting her to join a circle. I have also published a monthly newsletter, and along with the President, I have assigned circles to serve as hostesses for Church suppers and circle luncheons. I have attended circle meetings regularly. I also compiled the new 1979-1980 WOC Directory making changes and corrections when necessary and helped assemble some 200 copies. I also attended the World Day of Prayer at Bayside Presbyterian Church and the Adult Enrichment Series held at our Church in conjunction with Bible School."

STOP - The circles remembered the children with a birthday cake and a small gift for the birthday child each month.

Food Pantry - Our Church has been responsible for three weeks of the rotating food bank. At Christmas time we cleaned our cabinet and donated this food to St. Columbo. The cabinet was restocked by the generous gifts of the Church School Children to Jesus at his birthday party."
